- Pentecost Acts 2
 - God pours out his Spirit vv 4, 16-17 (quoting Joel 2:28)
 - believers proclaim God's praise vv 4-11
 - Peter's speech focuses on how God is acting vv 14-36
 - response invited from those whom 'the Lord our God' calls v 39
 - divine passive 'three thousand were added to their number that day' v 41

- The man at the Beautiful Gate Acts 3–4
 - 3:6, 13 'In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk!... the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our fathers, glorified his servant Jesus'
 - 3:8, 9 'He jumped to his feet and began to walk. Then he went with them into the temple, walking and jumping and praising God. When all the people saw him walking and praising God...'

- The man at the Beautiful Gate Acts 3–4
 - 3:11-12 'While the man held on to Peter and John, all the people were astonished and came running to them in the place called Solomon's Colonnade. When Peter saw this he said to them...'
 - 4:19-20 'But Peter and John answered them, "Which is right in God's eyes: to listen to you or to him? You be the judges! As for us, we cannot help speaking about what we have seen and heard."

- The man at the Beautiful Gate Acts 3–4
 - 4:24 'And when they heard this, they raised their voices together in prayer to God. "Sovereign Lord...you made the heaven and the earth and the sea, and everything in them..."

- The man at the Beautiful Gate Acts 3–4
 - 4:29-30 'And now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness.
 Stretch out your hand to heal and perform signs and wonders through the name of your holy servant Jesus.'

- The man at the Beautiful Gate Acts 3–4
 - 4:31 'After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit spoke the word of God boldly.'

- Persecution produces mission 8:1b-4
 - 'On that day a great persecution broke out against the church in Jerusalem, and all except the apostles were scattered throughout Judea and Samaria...3 But Saul began to destroy the church. Going from house to house, he dragged off both men and women and put them in prison.
 - 4 Those who had been scattered preached the word wherever they went.'

- Samaria 8:4-25
 - '5 Philip went down to a city in Samaria and proclaimed the Messiah there. 6 When the crowds heard Philip and saw the signs he performed, they all paid close attention to what he said. 7 With shrieks, evil spirits came out of many, and many who were paralysed or lame were healed.' vv 5-7

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- Samaria 8:4-25
 - 'you thought you could obtain the gift of God with money!' v 20

- The Ethiopian eunuch 8:26-40
 - 'Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Go south to the road—the desert road—that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza."
 - 'The Spirit told Philip, "Go to that chariot and stay near it." v 29

- The Ethiopian eunuch 8:26-40
 - 'So Philip ran to him and heard him reading Isaiah the prophet and asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?"... Now the passage of the Scripture that he was reading was this: "Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter and like a lamb before its shearer is silent, so he opens not his mouth. In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth."' vv 28, 30, 32-33 (Isa 53:7-8)

- The Ethiopian eunuch 8:26-40
 - 'And when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord carried Philip away' v 39

- Cornelius 10:1-48; 11:4-17; 15:7-9
 - God speaks to Cornelius by an angel 10:3-6, 31-32; 11:13-14
 - God sends Peter a vision 10:9-16;
 11:4-10
 - God times the arrival of the visitors 10:17; 11:11

- Cornelius 10:1-48; 11:4-17; 15:7-9
 - God tells Peter to welcome the visitors 10:19-20; 11:12
 - God sends the Spirit on Cornelius and his household 10:44-47; 11:15
 - God's action convinces the Jewish believers that it is God—and they praise God 10:47; 11:18

13:1 Now there were in the church at Antioch prophets and teachers, Barnabas, Simeon who was called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen a member of the court of Herod the tetrarch, and Saul. 2 While they were worshipping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, 'Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.' 3 Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off.

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- God's call to Macedonia 16:6-10
 - rare language of God calling v 10
 - God actively prevents Paul and his team preaching in Asia and Bithynia vv 6, 7



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 - rare language of God calling v 10
 - God actively prevents Paul and his team preaching Asia and Bithynia vv 6, 7
 - the night vision v 9
 - and the conclusion v 10



- the gospel in Philippi 16:12-15
 - they look for praying people v 13a
 - they speak the gospel v 13b
 - God opens Lydia's heart v 14
 - the new believing community is established in Lydia's home v 15

- the believers do not make things happen
- limited strategy and planning
 - travel along major Roman roads
 - going to major cities and towns
 - looking for people likely to be open to the gospel—synagogues
 - seeking bridges into the culture
 - avoiding ditches in the culture

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- limited strategy and planning
 - travel along major Roman roads
 - going to major cities and towns
 - looking for people likely to be open to the gospel—synagogues
 - staying as long as possible
 - Syrian Antioch: over a year 11:26
 - Corinth: over 18 months 18:11
 - Ephesus: over two years 19:10

'This went on for two years, so that all the Jews and Greeks who lived in the province of Asia heard the word of the Lord.' Acts 19:10

'In the same way, the gospel is bearing fruit and growing throughout the whole world—just as it has been doing among you since the day you heard it and truly understood God's grace. - the believers do not make things happen
- limited strategy and planning
- the danger we forget how passionate God is about wanting people to know him
 - the danger of over-activism
 - the danger of inactivism
 - 'I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow.' 1 Cor 3:6

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- not 'twitching puppets' (Ernst Haenchen)
- witness and proclamation 1:8
 - 'you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.'

- speaking and living the gospel in public
 - temple courts 2:46; 5:12b, 14
 - meeting Lydia in Philippi by the river 16:12-15
 - in a tentmaker's workshop in Corinth 18:2-3 (and Thessalonica, 1 Thess 2:9)
 - meeting outdoors 1 Cor 14:23-25
 - everyone a witness; not everyone a proclaimer


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

 - reflection and discernment needed


